Statement of Intent The Heys School's collective worship policy will foster high moral and ethical standards; encourage students to reflect on important issues; and demonstrate a caring attitude, enabling them to develop greater emotional intelligence and awareness of the needs of others.

This will be supported through the curriculum in ethics and philosophy (RE) and PSHCE during tutorial time and drop down days.

Policy Aims: To provide an opportunity for students to:

- Worship God
- Reflect on values that are of a broadly Christian nature and on their own beliefs
- Develop a community spirit with a common ethos and shared values (in line with The Heys Way)
- Consider spiritual, moral, cultural and ethical issues
- Respond to the worship offered

Implementation Collective worship, whether in assembly or form registration time will:

- Be acceptable to the whole school community
- Include a variety of elements at different times
- Involve the students we have a planned programme of collective worship which includes:
 - Assemblies held in Year Groups once per week delivered by a range of staff from SLT and the pastoral teams.
 - Whole school assemblies three times per year (or in response to events affecting the global school community when time for reflection is required). These are delivered by the Headteacher and or SLT.

Monitoring, Evaluation and Review

During the three year review cycle the school will review this policy and assess its implementation, effectiveness and impact. The policy will be promoted and implemented throughout the school. Parents have the right to withdraw their children from this activity as well as RE by notifying the Headteacher in writing.
